Summary

The ITAA United Bowmen Round tournament is an entry into the larger mail-in tournament coordinated by the United Bowmen of Philadelphia. The event uses the tournament round invented by the United Bowmen, and it is one of the oldest tournament rounds in the world.

The format is fourteen six-arrow ends shot at eighty yards. That's 84 arrows at 80 yards. The target is a 122cm, but only using 5 scoring sections, scored 9/7/5/3/1. On a modern World Archery target, that's using the 5 color zones, with the whole gold being worth 9 points, the whole red being worth 7 points, etc. The bravest competitors shoot this round using longbows for the complete challenge. Most of the crowd this year shot a score with a modern recurve, then switched to longbows to see how many arrows it took to even hit the target.
